Tammy Wynette was an American country music singer-songwriter and one of country music's best-known artists and biggest-selling female vocalists. She married George Jones, an award-winning American country music singer known for his long list of hit records, his distinctive voice and phrasing, in 1969. "Golden Ring" won the "Cash Box" magazine award as the Top Duet for 1976 and was a U.S. No.1 hit for them both. Unfortunately, by this time, George and Tammy's marriage had ended.

This tune actually tells the story of a young couple from the day they buy their "golden wedding ring", to the day that their marriage falls apart – so it is an eerie song for Tammy and George to have released. However, the tune itself is terrific; Terry MacMillan claimed it to be one of his personal favourites. As always happens, when we record a country tune, our superb Nashville musicians enjoyed the task and produced a piece of first class music with a lot of the original feel; this one is a show-stopper!

Where, When and Who produced the music:

This was part of the eleventh group of releases on Sting and Snow that were recorded in Nashville, during November 2006. A total of fourteen songs were recorded during this session, which was the sixth to be arranged and produced by Paul Bristow. On this occasion, Paul had his family with him to provide moral AND technical support! Also in attendance at this session was Snow Recording Artist: Wil Stans.

Recorded in November 2006, the music still features the top musicians in Nashville: Gregg Galbraith – as band leader playing all lead Guitars, Terry MacMillan on Harmonica and percussion, Doug Jernigan on Steel and Dobro, Jerry Kroon on Drums, Roger Morris on Piano and Keyboards, Fiddle by Rob Hojacos, Larry Paxton on Bass Guitar, Rhythm Guitar was played by Bruce Watkins and Mark Catstevens, with Bruce also on Banjo. We also had George Tidwell on Trumpet and Kevin McManus (studio owner) as the engineer.
