Bryan Adams is an outstanding song-writer and performer from Canada, he still holds the world record for the longest running U.K. no.1 song (Everything I Do, from the Kevin Costner version of Robin Hood). He teamed up with with Melanie Chisholm (A.K.A. "Mel C") one of the Spice Girls and had a hit with this tune.

We have managed to make use of most of the original song in producing this Square Dance version; the Chorus is featured on the Middle Break and Closer. You will be able to hear that our Nashville team really enjoyed themselves when we recorded this track, whilst all of the music is excellent, bright and powerful – as per the original – some of it is outstanding; especially on the choruses. This is a great up-beat track and really gets the dancers moving.

Where, When and Who produced the music:

This was part of the seventh group of releases on Sting that were recorded in Nashville. A total of fourteen songs were recorded during this session, which was the second to be arranged and produced by Paul Bristow – following his purchase of the company – alongside Associate Producer: James Wyatt.

Recorded in September 2002, the music still featured the top session musicians in Nashville. Although the line-up would change occasionally, it would normally include: Gregg Galbraith – who acts as band leader - on guitars, Terry McMillan on Harmonica and percussion, Doug Jernigan on Steel and Dobro, Jerry Kroon on Drums, Roger Smith on Piano and keyboards with Rob Hojacos on fiddle, David Smith on Bass Guitar and Bruce Watkins on Rhythm Guitar / Banjo / Mandolin. Also worthy of special mention is our engineer on these sessions – also the studio owner – Kevin McManus.
